

Referee Info Sheet

- 1. Please arrive at least 15-20 mins prior to game time. Please let me know if you will be running later than that.**
- 2. If you cannot work your scheduled games please let me know ASAP, preferably 24 hours in advance.**
- 3. Do not talk back to or scream at the coaches or fans during the game. If the coach asks you a question politely answer to the best of your knowledge at the next break.**
- 4. Dress code...no jeans allowed, please wear athletic shorts or pants and tennis shoes or cleats. T-shirts or sweatshirts are fine, absolutely no inappropriate slogans or prints.**
- 5. All equipment is stored in the referee room, please return all soccer game balls, stop watches and flags to the ref room after your last game.**
- 6. Make sure you stay on schedule between games. It is ok for you to take a break but please remember you are in charge of keeping the games going...if your game is scheduled to start at 6:00 you should be on the field ready to play at 6:00 not starting to collect your equipment at 6:00.**
- 7. No eating on the playing field before or during the game....finish your candy bar before you walk onto the field.**
- 8. The use of cell phones, ipods, or other mp3 devices during the game is not allowed if you are caught using one you will be asked to leave.**
- 9. Each scheduled shift you get \$5.00 in concessions, drinks included...the only exception is water. You cannot use your concessions tab for any other person.**
- 10. If you have any issues during the game with the coaches and/or fans stop the game and proceed as follows:**
 - a. first time: give them a warning that they need to calm down**
 - b. second time: firmly but politely ask them to go to the parking lot (do not scream or raise your voice, do not try to explain your self, if they have question tell them to come and talk to Suzanne)**

******Any time you give a warning or are having issues please let me know as soon as possible, so that I can assist you.**
- 11. As a referee make sure that you are helping the kids learn the game....if they have a bad throw in explain why it was bad and show them how to correctly throw the ball in, etc.**
